



Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) about EPIC A program of East Bay Agency for Children

Who is eligible for EPIC services?

To be eligible for EPIC services, a child must be enrolled at one of EPIC's partner school sites during the academic year. During summer programming, EPIC can serve children without an IEP as long as they have full scope Medi-Cal and reside in Alameda County,

What is the time commitment for families?

In order for the EPIC program to be successful, a high degree of caregiver involvement is needed, including in person or telehealth/phone sessions. EPIC also works with the child's school site staff 4 times a week. On average, about 2 hours a month of sessions occur for families and school site staff.

Does EPIC provide transportation?

EPIC is not able to provide transportation. Families (or an authorized adult) will need to drop-off and pick-up their child at the site where EPIC offers services both during the academic year and during summer programming.
